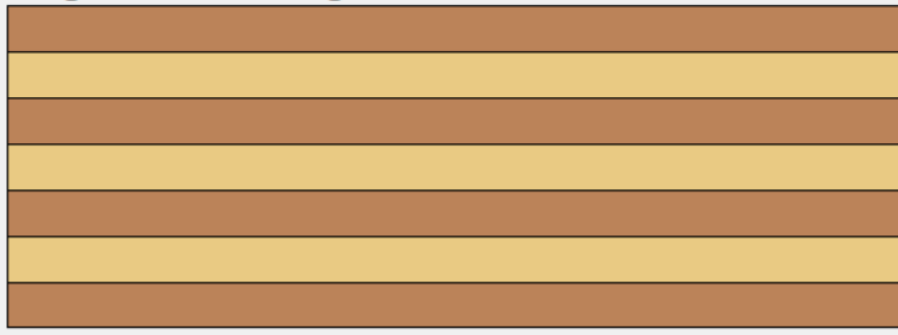


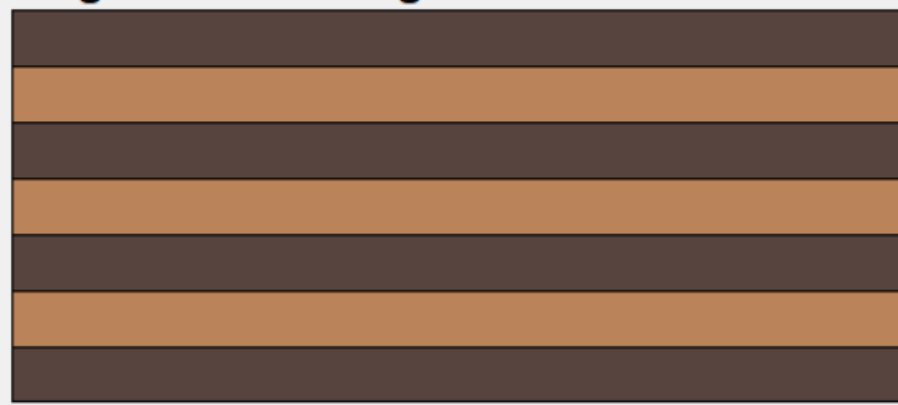


Smaller Plaid Large Dimensions: 14" Width, 20" Length, 2" Width
Blade Kerf: 0.125"

1. Glue 7 sections alternating Cherry/Maple (2" wide x 20" long ea)

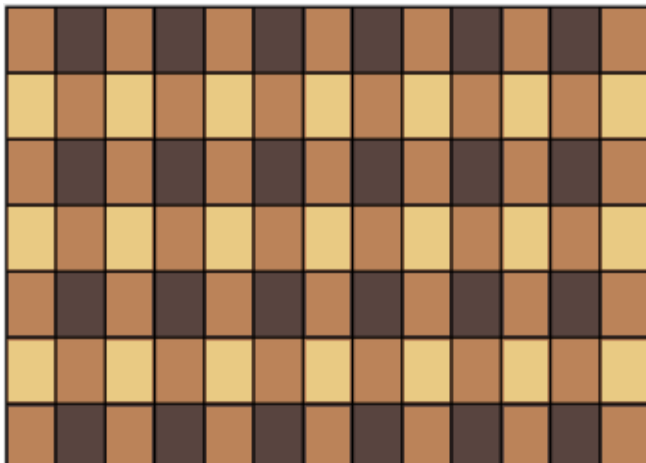


2. Glue 7 sections alternating Walnut/Cherry (2" wide x 18" ea)

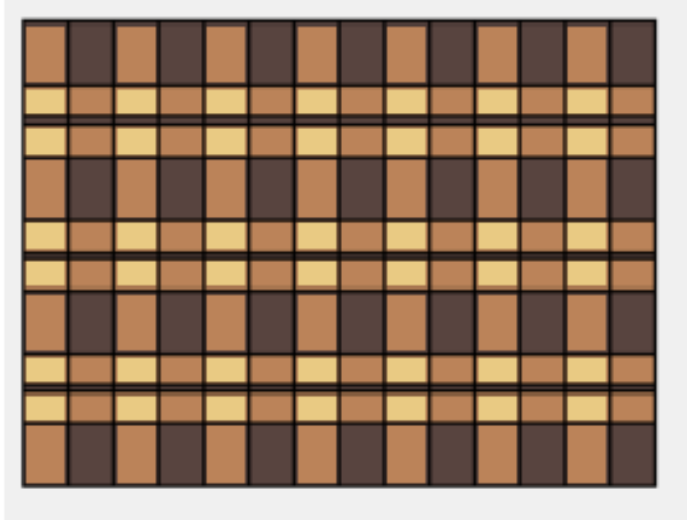


3. Plain each board from (1) and (2) down, I think 1.5" – 2" would be best

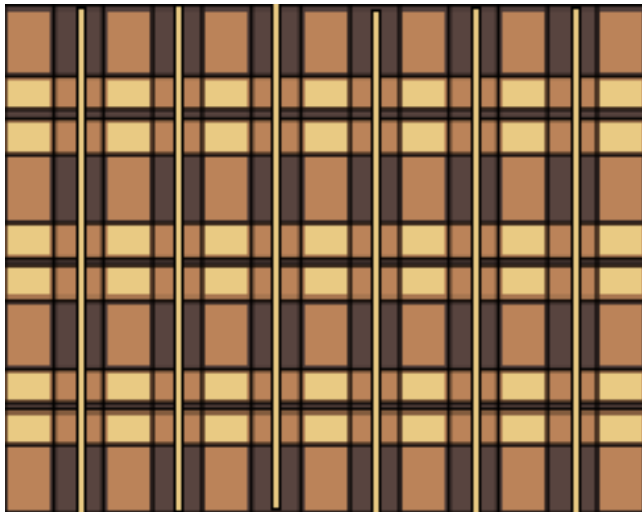
4. Cross cut both at your desired thickness (maybe 1.5 or 2"), rotate 90 degrees, and glue every other one. I think 13 alternating strips at 1.5" would look nice.



5. Slice every other section horizontally (2, 4, and 6) and glue in a walnut strip. Grain direction is something to consider. It's a lot of extra work, but gluing together a bunch of walnut boards to make one ~20" wide for the strips would be ideal, because then it will be entirely end grain.



6. Slice every other section horizontally (2, 4, 6, 8, 10, 12) and glue in maple strip. Again, I'd glue together a maple strip that is ~14" wide to get the entire board to be end grain.



7. Once this is done, sand and finish as desired 😊
